For six years, Joani has worked to move the cause of literacy forward at the provincial level, providing support and information to member councils, advocating for literacy, and managing various projects. Joani moves on to pursue her interests in translation, but the cause of literacy remains close to her heart.



The Yamaska Literacy Council was the first organization Joani volunteered for after moving to the Townships in 1995. She has volunteered at the Brome Fair and sat across from the cattle judging spot. So, thanks to YLC she has learned how to judge a cow. She was recruited by Freda Hudson as Vice President, learning several years later that this meant she was next in line as President. YLC's 30TH ANNIVERSARY

The Yamaska Literacy Council celebrates thirty years of literacy service in the community. Formed in 1981 as the Townshipers' Reading Council, the council trains volunteers to work one-on-one with adults who want to improve their literacy skills. **EACH ONE TEACH ONE** is an adult teaching philosophy that supports student-centered instruction. It encourages tutors to identify the student's needs and design learning activities to meet their individual needs.

YLC partnered with community radio station CIDI fm 99.1 to host a series of radio shows on literacy, and held an anniversary event at Radio Village Hall to celebrate with members and community



partners, past and current. As part of the anniversary celebrations, YLC launched a collection of stories from students, tutors and community partners. Wendy Seys, YLC Coordinator, says "Our successes are told in stories. Getting a driver's license, reading to a child, or voting for the first time—these are the stories that speak to the life changes brought about through literacy".

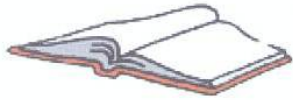

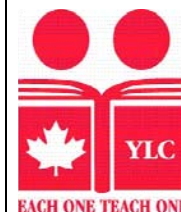
Climax and Resolution:
